## **Programming & Services Overview**

Nearing the end of the academic year, Reinert Center staff continued their focus on inclusive teaching, hosting related events and developing new web-based resources for faculty. #### **Black Man/White Tower**

On March 1, Dr. Bryant Keith Alexander (Professor and Dean, College of Communication and Fine Arts at Loyola Marymount University) gave a performative presentation on being a Black/gay/male/professor/ administrator and how issues of race and gender identity have the potential to circumvent and reorient issues of power. This event was part of the Center's year-long focus on Inclusive Teaching.

### **Ignatian Pedagogy Institute**

Also in March, we held our annual Ignatian Pedagogy Institute. This year's focus was on discernment and intellectual inquiry. This day-long event featured sessions on Ignatian discernment (led by Fr. Chris Collins, S.J.), connecting Ignatian discernment and intellectual inquiry, inquiry-based learning, and discerning one's teaching vocation. This event was the third in a three-year cycle. In 2018, the three-year cycle will begin again with a focus on contemplative pedagogy.
