

## SLU LAW BLSA DIVERSITY LEADERS SCHOLARSHIP

A scholarship created to provide critical resources for current SLU LAW BLSA members who have demonstrated leadership, a commitment to BLSA, and dedication to the advancement of social justice

#### **REQUIREMENTS**

- 1. A recipient must be a dues-paying member of SLU LAW BLSA in good academic standing;
- 2. A recipient *can* be any current full-time or a part-time student, except that 2018-2019 BLSA Executive Board members are not eligible for this scholarship;
- 3. A preference will be given to applicants who demonstrate the following qualities:
  - Commitment to BLSA
    - Can be demonstrated through involvement, engagement, and contribution regarding BLSA events and activities
  - Commitment to social justice goals
    - Can be demonstrated through things like advocacy for social justice, equity issues, involvement in organizations working towards such goals, etc.
  - Strong leadership
    - Can be demonstrated through activities and involvements that have required the applicant to take on responsibility and exhibit initiative in completing at task or working towards a goal either in BLSA or in other capacities
  - Documented financial need
    - Can be demonstrated by submitting a narrative discussing the nature of one's financial hardships.

The criteria set forth in this application applies to the Spring 2019 BLSA Leader's Scholarship. Criteria may be changed for the year 2020 and thereafter.

In order to be considered for a scholarship, a student must complete and sign the application and complete the two questions on the following page. Announcements will be made at the BLSA Judicial Reception held at SLU LAW in April 2019.
