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The Everett M. Sugarbaker Scholarship, established by the Everett D. and Geneva V. Sugarbaker Foundation, supports the foundation's mission of providing primary health care for people in developing countries. Everett M. Sugarbaker was a Saint Louis University Medical student who was dedicated to serving the needs of others and providing medical care. The scholarship was established in his memory to ensure his mission continues at Saint Louis University School of Medicine.

Applicants must be full-time fourth year medical students who plan to devote a period of time serving primary health care needs for people in less developed countries. Preference will be given to students attending the Sugarbaker Memorial Clinic in Nyeri, Kenya (but exceptions can be made). 2. Include an estimated budget for the trip. Allowable expenses include, travel, lodging, food, vaccinations, etc.

Scholarship awards will be up to \$2,000 based on availability of funds. The award will reimburse your allowable expenses.

Post-Elective Report Guidelines
2016-2017**

The report should include equal information about BOTH your cross-cultural experiences and your work (project) in the clinics, hospitals, etc. We need to be able to tell from your report that you worked on your project and what the outcome was. Your observations on the uniqueness of the setting in which you lived and worked and the effects of the experience on you as a U.S. medical student are important components of the report.

- The report should be a minimum of three pages long.
- Include the dates of the trip and the name and contact information of your overseas preceptor.
- This report is used to help other SLU medical students plan for international experiences, so it is entirely appropriate to include “tips”.
- Include at least two photographs of your work with patients. If you do not want to give the actual photos, feel free to make copies and send them electronically.
- Submit receipts (e.g.: airfare, lodging, etc.) for reimbursement up to your awarded amount for allowable expenses.
- Reports and reimbursement requests are due in the Office of Curricular Affairs within 30 days after the ending date of the elective. Reports, photos and receipts may be sent electronically to Denise Parker (dparker6@slu.edu). Reports received late may not be eligible for reimbursement.
- All information submitted will be shared with representatives of the Sugarbaker Foundation.
