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#### BIOGRAPHY

Dr. Scott Griggs is an Assistant Professor of Pharmacy Administration (Department of Pharmaceutical and Administrative Sciences), at the St. Louis College of Pharmacy (STLCOP). His primary research interests include pharmacoeconomics and health outcomes, social and behavioral aspects of pharmacy, entrepreneurship, medication errors, and the future of pharmacy/healthcare.

Dr. Griggs has over 20 years' experience in community pharmacy, working as a pharmacist at Albertsons, CostCo, Target, the University of Texas Health Center Pharmacy, as well as several independent/compounding pharmacies. He is currently licensed as a pharmacist in both Texas and Missouri. Prior to joining STLCOP, Dr. Griggs was a graduate teaching assistant at the University of Texas (Austin) College of Pharmacy for a number of courses: Basic Intravenous Admixtures, Experiential Pharmacy Practice and Patient Counseling, Immunizations, Pharmacy Ethics and Professional Communications, Pharmacoeconomics, and Advanced Pharmacotherapy Lab. Dr. Griggs was awarded the Texas Excellence in Teaching Award (TETA) as the teaching assistant of the year (UT Austin, College of Pharmacy) for the 2004-05 academic year. In July 2007, Dr. Griggs began an academic appointment as Assistant Professor, Pharmacy Practice, at the University of the Incarnate Word, Feik School of Pharmacy, San Antonio, TX. While at Incarnate Word, Dr. Griggs designed (course creator) and taught: Pharmacoeconomics and Outcomes I, Pharmacoeconomics and Outcomes II, and Pharmacy Management, in addition to assisting with several other courses. In the summer of 2009, Dr. Griggs returned to Austin to complete his PhD dissertation while continuing to work as a staff pharmacist for Target. He then accepted a position as Assistant Professor, Pharmacy Administration, at the St. Louis College of Pharmacy in October 2011. At STLCOP, Dr. Griggs currently coordinates and teaches Healthy Systems Management-Economic Aspects as well as two elective courses: Pharmacoeconomics and Outcomes Research and Introduction to Pharmacy Entrepreneurship. At SLUCOR, Dr. Griggs currently teaches Introduction to Pharmacoeconomics as well as collaborating on various pharmacy-related research projects. Dr. Griggs enjoys advising and mentoring students. He was awarded the STLCOP Advisor of the Year for 2012-13 for his role as the Faculty Advisor for the NCPA student chapter at STLCOP, a position with which he is still actively involved.

Dr. Griggs was born in Dallas, Texas and grew up in Austin, Texas. He currently lives in Glendale, MO with his wife, Kerie, and three kids: Andrew, Connor, and Avery.
