PEDIATRIC FUNDAMENTAL CRITICAL CARE SUPPORT (PFCCS)

PFCCS is a major resource for those interested in learning how to recognize critical illness and initiate care for the critically ill pediatric patient. It will also serve as a valuable education tool for those entering the field of pediatric emergency medicine, pediatric critical care, and disaster response medicine.

COURSE PURPOSE

- To prepare physicians, physician-assistants, nurse practitioners, nurses, respiratory therapists, transport teams, and EMT/paramedics for the first 24 hours of pediatric critical care until transferred or appropriate critical care consultation is obtained.
- To prepare non-intensivists to manage the acute deterioration of critically ill pediatric patients.
- To prepare pediatric, emergency medicine, and surgical house staff for Pediatric critical care medicine.

PFCCS LEARNING OBJECTIVES

At the conclusion of this course, participants should be able to:

- Prioritize assessment needs for the critically ill or injured infant and child.
- Select appropriate diagnostic tests
- Respond to significant changes in the unstable pediatric patient
- Recognize and initiate management of acute life-threatening conditions
- Determine the need for expert consultation and/or patient transfer and the optimal methodology accomplishing patient transfer
- Team building through high fidelity simulations with videotaped performance debriefings
