Safety-Net Healthcare Advocacy Research and Policy (SHARP) Collaborative **Co-Founder and Co-Director (in collaboration with Dr. Rhonda BeLue)**

The mission of the Safety-net Healthcare Advocacy Research and Policy (SHARP) Collaborative was to address healthcare disparities by conducting applied research, training, and community engagement activities in partnership with healthcare safety-net and community-based organizations. SHARP initiatives emphasized the critical, often overlooked influence of local-level health policies on health inequities experienced by underserved populations. The intent of the collaborative was to create informed and attentive future leaders in healthcare research, policy, advocacy, and management while making health equity a quality improvement imperative. Participating students:

- Increased knowledge related to local health, social, education, and urban development policies through quarterly training workshops and bi-weekly, interdisciplinary sessions led by SHARP co-directors and mentors from community-based organizations.
- Built competencies and gained hands-on experience in observation and assessment, analysis, strategic thinking, organizational management, leadership, and cultural humility.
- Co-learned and collaborated with local advocates to address urgent community health needs.

Key Accomplishment:

- In 2018-2019, 26 multidisciplinary students (MPH, MPH/JD, MHA/JD, MHA, MD) provided varying levels of project support to inform two Gateway Region YMCA programs: Women Empowered to End Disparities in Obesity (WEDO), and Healthy Schools, Healthy Communities (HSHC). The project was a CBPR initiative to assess North County (St. Louis) policies that influence healthy eating and physical activity. At the end of the academic year, students presented key research findings to the community, including: an executive summary of existing policies; policy recommendations informed by a rapid literature review and discussions with local community advocates; and a searchable codebook of relevant local ordinances.
