Course Description

The session will provide opportunities to examine and evaluate values and ethics through a variety of client groups and practice situations. Participants will explore the often-competing values of individuals, groups, and communities. Ethical principles from the National Association of Social Workers Code of Ethics, and the Codes of Ethics of the National Association of Black Social Workers and the International Federation of Social Workers will be discussed as these apply to the situations identified. The session will explore the benefits and challenges of identifying and applying contextual priorities to decision making in order to enhance ethical competence with clients.
