Men of Color, Myths and Health

What social workers and public health practitioners should know about health disparities and engaging systems with support

Course Description

This course begins with a global focus on HIV and AIDS, and expands to other co-occurring chronic illnesses such as hypertension, diabetes, substance use, mental health, violence and other issues affection men of color. It will examine common psychological reactions to living at risk, common myths, community and cultural practices that intersect with gendered expressions of masculinity that influence men of color health behaviors. It will cover knowledge and skills in cultural competent assessment and intervention planning.
