#### **Admission Procedures**

Undergraduate students may apply to the College of Education and Public Service either at the time of their admission to the University or upon completion of at least 15 credit hours with a cumulative grade point average appropriate to their major. Students may obtain inter-university transfer applications and declaration of major forms from the Dean's Office of the College of Education and Public Service.

Once accepted into the College of Education and Public Service, students are assigned an academic advisor. After declaring their major, students are also assigned a faculty mentor

During 2009-2010, 97% of Saint Louis University's initial teacher education program completers passed all required state certification tests. The statewide pass rate that year for program completers was 98%. During that year SLU placed 52 student teachers, with a student teacher to supervisor ratio of 3.25:1.

The Department of Education has developed programs that meet Missouri State requirements for teacher certification in Early Childhood, Early Childhood Special Education, Elementary, Middle (Language Arts, Math, Science and Social Studies), Secondary (Biology, English, Foreign Language, Math, General Science, and Social Studies), and Elementary with Mild/Moderate Disabilities, K-12. Course offerings provide students with classroom and field-based experiences essential in the learning process. Programs are accredited by both the Missouri Department of Elementary and Secondary Education and NCATE. Successful completion of a 4-year program portfolio is required for certification. Background checks are required prior to field-based experiences.

Students should consult with their advisors to select courses that will fulfill their core and major requirements.
