Program Overview

Interprofessional Education (IPE) Program at Saint Louis University offers a Minor in Interprofessional Practice for undergraduate students in health related programs. A Concentration in Interprofessional Practice is awarded if only a select set of the Minor courses are completed. The Minor and Concentration in Interprofessional Practice offer the opportunities for students in the health professions education programs of Saint Louis University to study with students representing health professions.
