

Missouri Voters' Opinions on Abortion

The following document summarizes the opinions of likely voters in Missouri on issues related to abortion. These results are from SLU/YouGov Polls conducted from June 2020 to February 2024. The SLU/YouGov Poll is a biannual survey of likely Missouri voters aiming to inform policymakers, citizens, and researchers of Missourians' opinions on important issues facing the state.

Key Missouri Findings

- At least 60 percent of Democratic, Republican, and Independent voters support abortion being legal in cases of rape, incest, and when the woman's life is endangered (Aug. 2022 Poll)
- 44 percent of voters support the proposed ballot initiative to legalize abortion in Missouri. 37 percent oppose. 19 percent are not sure. (Feb. 2024 Poll)
